

**Pr Jean Dupouy-Camet** was born in 1953 in Caracas, Venezuela. He is Emeritus Professor of Medical Parasitology & Mycology in Paris Descartes University and he was head of the department of Parasitology- Mycology of Cochin Hospital (Assistance Publique-Hôpitaux de Paris, France). He holds a MD (general practice), a specialization in Tropical medicine, a degree in Medical Mycology (Institut Pasteur, Paris) and a PhD in Parasitology, all obtained in Paris University.

He is past president of the International Commission on Trichinellosis, past general secretary of the French Society of Parasitology and past President of the European Federation of Parasitologists.

He has organized the Xth International Conference on Trichinellosis (Fontainebleau, France, august 2000) and the Xth European Multicolloquium on Parasitology EMOP 10 (Paris, august 2008).

He has been invited for lectures and teaching in many countries: Australia, Algeria, Bangladesh, Belgium, Brazil, Burkina-Faso, Canada, Cambodia, China, Colombia, Croatia, Denmark, Egypt, Equator, Ethiopia, France, Finland, Germany, French Guiana, India, Iran, Italy, Ivory Coast, Korea, Laos, Lithuania, Mexico, Morocco, Netherlands, Pakistan, Palestine, Peru, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, Togo, Tunisia, Turkey, UK, USA, Venezuela...

He has published more than 200 scientific papers (165 in Medline) in the field of various aspects of parasitology, molecular aspects of parasitology (PCR, sequencing, identification), tropical medicine, medical mycology, trichinellosis, diphyllbothriosis, toxoplasmosis... He coordinated two books "La trichinellose, une zoonose en évolution" with Claude Soulé, OIE ed. and "Guidelines for the surveillance, management, prevention and control of trichinellosis" with Darwin Murrell, FAO, OIE, WHO eds and wrote chapters (trichinellosis, diphyllbothriosis, ocular toxoplasmosis) for several books. He is member of the editorial board of "Parasite", the journal of the French society of Parasitologists.

He received in August 2008 and July 2016, the Medal of the European Federation of Parasitologists and in August 2014 the "Distinguished Achievement Award" of the World Federation of Parasitologists. He is honorary member of the Egyptian United society of Parasitology, of the Serbian society of Parasitology and of the International Commission on Trichinellosis. He was appointed in May 2015 as "Distinguished visiting Professor" in Tehran University of Medical Sciences (TUMS).

His present interests are food-borne parasitosis, history of parasitology and paleoparasitology.
