Internal Medicine Residency Curriculum

The Internal Medicine Residency in all Iranian universities is a 4-year program, which, as entry requirements, has a Nationwide Entrance Exam. Graduation from this program is also based on satisfactory results in the Nationwide Board Examination of Internal Medicine.

The contents of the Internal Medicine program in Tehran University of Medical Sciences in Shariati Hospital and Sina Hospital is composed of a core general internal medicine (inpatient, emergency department, and inpatient services), subspecialty rotations and elective courses. Each academic year is partitioned into 12 rotation blocks.

Table 1 indicates how each residency year fills those 12 blocks:

The course content for each rotation consists of planning for clinical evaluations, management, and following up of patients with common medical diseases in our region. Internal Medicine residents should actively participate in all steps of management under supervision of the faculty members of the Internal Medicine Department. In addition to the clinical responsibilities of the residents in inpatient, outpatient,



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and emergency services, there are also didactic lectures and conferences, such as morning reports, journal clubs and subspecialty conferences which have been collected in the weekly program of the department (Table 2).

Assessment

- Written Exams (Multiple Choice Questions, hereby referred to as MCQ):
 - Pre-Ertegha (Yearly Promotion): Each season, a written exam will be held, which amount to t a total of three times per year in the Department of Internal Medicine.
 - o Ertegha (Board Eligibility) exam in Tehran University of Medical Sciences
 - National Board of Internal Medicine
- Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE): One exam per year
- Global Rating Form: It is completed for each rotation monthly (including the items of Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education, aka ACGME).
- Internal Medicine Board Exam (MCQ and OSCE)
