- The oldest university in Central Europe;
- Comprehensive in scope, offering more than 300 accredited degree programmes;
- The largest and the best-performing research institution in the Czech Republic.





About Charles University


- I7 faculties;

Study in foreign languages

- Over 170 programmes in foreign languages (mainly English);
- Students at Charles University come from 70+ countries around the world;
- Charles University 5th most popular European university in Erasmus+ programme.





Study - 2016

- The bachelor's programs: 18,000+ students
- The non-structured master's programs: 15,000+
- The follow-up master's programs: 9,000+
- Postgraduate doctoral programs: 7,600+
- The highest numbers of students: medicinal and pharmaceutical courses, social sciences and science-focused and educational courses

Funding

- Funded by European Regional Development Fund (through OP RDI – Ministry of Education)
- Estimated total project cost: 100 mil. EUR
- EU Funding: 80 mil. EUR





New Research Programme

PRIMUS

- The main aim: to encourage young researchers with international experience to establish new research groups and laboratories;
- Selected young scientists will be enabled to run their own independent projects during a period of 3-5 years;
- One of the long-term goals is to increase the success rate of the University in attracting major international grants (e.g. ERC grants).

International Cooperation

- International Joint Master and PhD programs, cotutelles:
 - e.g. Charles University acts as co-ordinator of recently accredited joint degree: <u>MA</u>
 <u>European Politics and Society</u> (co-operation of Charles University, Leiden University,
 University Pompeu Fabra Barcelona and Jagiellonian University);
 - o Joint degree programmes with several German universities;
 - I I new "cotutelles" agreements in 2016 with universities in France, Germany, Belgium, Switzerland, Poland, Spain, the Netherlands, Italy, Brazil and Finland.



International Cooperation

- Post-doc programme at CU targeted at young international researchers;
- Erasmus+ mobility (approx. 1,800 incoming and 1,300 outgoing students per year);
- 130 international researchers from 23 partner universities at CU in 2016;
- Strategic partnerships with 14 universities including Heidelberg University, KU Leuven, Leiden University, Peking University etc.;
- About 200 bilateral agreements with universities all over the world.

- 2/ increase the number of PhD students spending several months at partner institution abroad (joint-degree or double degree)
- 3/ increase the number of foreign researchers coming to CU (lectures, research collaborating activities)
- 4/ increase the number of post-doc researchers funded by CU and their educational role for local research
