Report on Visit to Institute for Public Health and Addiction (ISFG)

University of Zurich (UZH), Switzerland

The visit to the Institute for Public Health and Addiction (ISGF - Institut für Sucht- und Gesundheitsforschung) was conducted aiming to finalize the smartphone-based intervention of the research project titled "Guided smartphone-based treatment for patients in opioid maintenance treatment in Iran - transdiagnostic treatment for substance use and common mental disorders".

The mentioned project is being carried out through a collaboration between the Iranian National Center for Addiction Studies (INCAS), Vice-Chancellor of Research and Technology, Tehran University of Medical Sciences (TUMS) and the ISGF, the World Health Organization Collaborative Center (WHO-CC) of the University of Zurich (UZH: Universität Zürich) and with the financial support of the Swiss National Science Foundation.

The aim of the study is to evaluate the effectiveness of a newly designed, culturally adapted, gender-sensitive, guided smartphone intervention based on integrated community reinforcement approach (CRA) and cognitive behavioral treatment (CBT) among patients receiving opioid agonist treatments (OATs) in Tehran, Iran.

The principal investigators of the project are Prof. Michael Schaub, Associate Professor in UZH and Scientific Director of ISGF, and Prof. Afarin Rahimi-Movaghar, Professor of Psychiatry and Director of INCAS. The project has received approval of the Institutional Research Ethics Committee of Vice-Chancellor of Research and Technology, TUMS (ethics committee reference number: IR.TUMS.MEDICINE.REC.1399.714) and has been registered in Iranian Registry of Clinical Trials (IRCT) (IRCT registration number: IRCT20170702034844N8).

With coordination with Department of Neuroscience, Addiction Studies and Neuroimaging of School of Advanced Technologies in Medicine (SATIM), TUMS, it was decided that this project is carried out as dissertation of Mr. Eisa Naghizadeh, PhD student of addiction studies.
