Symposium-Webinar on 'Internationalization of Higher Education During Corona Virus Crisis'

A 3-day Symposium-Webinar on 'Internationalization of Higher Education During Corona Virus Crisis', which was planned on the initiative of the TUMS Directorate of International Relations, was held on May 18-20, 2020. The main purpose of this symposium-webinar was to address the most important educational issues resulted following the outbreak and spread of the Coronavirus.







Dr. Mohammad Hossein Nekoofar, the TUMS Director of International Relations and Head of the symposium, announced the participation and cooperation of 33 world-renowned speakers from 25 universities and institutes of Iran and 15 countries who have scientific authority in the field of International Higher Education. The international speakers of this seminar were from Iran, Canada, Spain, Australia, the Czech Republic, Greece, Malaysia, Thailand, China, Finland, Germany, the United States, Hong Kong, Italy, Tanzania and the Netherlands. During this symposium-webinar, MediTec project was introduced to the audience and they got familiar with the whole project via its website. It is worth mentioning that 1187 Participants from 54 Countries attended this webinar. 17
